I. Opened by Chair-Dr. Sheri Rowland

Welcome and introductions of first-time attendees.

II. Treasurer's Report

Eileen Storck presented the Treasurer's report.

This meeting had expenses of \$12,060 and revenue of \$12,450 (surplus \$389.79).

Current account balance is \$14,591.57.

III. Secretary's Report

Approved the proposed edits to the CSA Handbook.

Updated document will be posted on the CSA Council website.

IV. Chair's Report

Dr. Rowland shared her work and involvement with the Council of Presidents since becoming CSA Chair.

Dr. Erin Richman, Eileen Storck, and Dr. Claire Brady shared insights from this summer's Next Generation Dual Enrollment gathering where they represented CSA. Large group discussion ensued.

Dr. Rowland shared that COP is overall supporting the new tiered funding model, however they are still working on actual calculations.

Dr. Bob Bade shared the FCSAA October 2019 meeting agenda topics:

Division I/Division II Scholarship Differences

Permissible Aid:

Athletic scholarship and Grants-in-Aid Guidelines by Division: Divisional play is designated by sport, not by school or athletic department.

Division Allowances:

Division I programs may provide a maximum grant-in-aid consisting of:

- Tuition and course fees
- Room & Board
- Course-related books
- Up to \$250 in course required supplies per academic year, provided such course supplies are required by all students in the course and specified in the institutions catalog or course syllabus
- Transportation costs one time per academic year to and from the college direct route

Division II programs may provide a maximum grant-in-aid consisting of:

- Tuition and course fees
- Course-related books
- Up to \$250 in course required supplies per academic year, provided such course supplies are required by all students in the course and specified in the institutions catalog or course syllabus
- Division III programs may not provide any athletic scholarship/aid of any kind
- Housing arrangements

Division II/III programs may not offer room and/or board through a fee, voucher, or any other system

Division II/III programs may provide information regarding housing, so long as no arrangements are made by the member college.

Doug Ryan will be leading an FCSAA research project focused on retention of student athletes and student leaders across the system.

VI. Top Issues facing today's Student Affairs Professionals

Dr. Saul Reyes presented a large group reflection/discussion regarding top issues facing our field.

- Campus Safety
- Student mental health
- White supremacy, free speech, and related issues
- The perceived diminishing value of a college degree
- Shrinking budgets

- Declining student enrollments
- Rising tuition costs
- Crushing student loan debt
- Increasing demands on Student Affairs professionals
- Unsustainable staff turnover rates

VII. Nuts and Bolts

Sharing of ideas and internal policies related to the following areas of concern were addressed during the Nuts and Bolts session: child care support for students, discipline tag on transcripts, student complaints/grievances, Florida residency & potential audit findings, and serving students displaced by Hurricane Dorian.
